LBR 9020-1	New rule sets forth requirements for a motion for a contempt order.
LBR 9021-1(a)(2)	In (A), permits an order to be lodged with the court if all responding parties have approved the form of the order. In (D), clarifies that parties should not submit proposed orders on the motions listed on <u>LBF #9021</u> , as the court will enter a form order or otherwise act on the motion.
